FREEPORTS: WHAT ARE THEY AND WHAT CAN THEY DO FOR MY BUSINESS?



A Freeport is a designated geographic area within the UK where goods can be imported, stored and re-exported with certain advantages and incentives. These incentives are designed to attract investment, boost economic activity, create jobs, and enhance trade. This was part of the governments levelling up exercise and the Freeport in the North West is in the Liverpool city region.

So what are the main benefits of a Freeport?

If you are importing and/or exporting there are considerable advantages in using a Freeport to conduct your business. When you import goods you would normally pay VAT and Duty on the imported goods as part of the customs clearance. However, if you import directly into a Freeport zone, then the VAT and Duty is suspended. No VAT and duty is paid until the goods enter the UK domestic market. So for example, if you import in bulk during the summer so that goods are ready for sale in the winter, under normal circumstances you would have to pay the VAT and duty when the goods arrive in the UK. Using a Freeport would defer this payment until the goods leave the Freeport warehouse. This will give you a considerable cash flow advantage as cash is not tied up in your stored goods.

out of the country, then there is no VAT or duty paid at all. Your goods can also benefit from duty inversion, which is where the goods leaving the Freeport attract a lower tariff than their component parts so that the duty is calculated on the final goods rather than the sum of its parts. You have the option to choose the lower rate of duty. The customs clearance process is also simplified for importing animal products or controlled substances. Customs checks on these items can be suspended until they are removed from the Freeport.

Additionally, if you re-export those goods directly



Where raw materials are imported, and then used in a manufacturing process here in the UK, and then the finished goods are exported, then potentially, there is no duty payable.

There is no time limit for storing the goods within the Freeport and customs declarations are simplified when using a Freeport. This is a huge opportunity to simplify the importing and exporting procedures that have come in since Brexit.

So you can see there are considerable benefits in using a Freeport for importing and exporting which can save you considerable sums in VAT and duty along with improving the cash flow of your business. In addition, it is right here on your doorstep.

MAJOR INVESTMENT CONTINUES AT MACCLESFIELD HOSPITAL

David RutleyMember of Parliament for Macclesfield

As we recently celebrated the NHS' 75th Anniversary, Macclesfield Hospital continues its reinvestment programme with the re-opening of the much-valued Maternity Unit and the unveiling of the brand-new Elective Treatment Centre. Macclesfield MP, David Rutley, had the chance to see first-hand the initiatives included in the £12 million which has been invested in clinical services since 2022, during his most recent meeting with Ged Murphy, Chief Executive of the East Cheshire NHS Trust.

David was delighted to see the state-of-the-art maternity unit fully operating, following its reopening on 26th June. Since then, the dedicated staff have supported many local families with 90 babies having been born since the services recommenced. David was pleased to see how happy the maternity unit team were to be back in Macclesfield supporting local families and using the latest medical equipment to help them in their work.

During the visit, David also had the opportunity to see the brand-new Elective Treatment Centre, which was unveiled on 19th June. After being awarded £6 million funding from the NHS England Targeted Investment Funding programme, the purpose-built centre provides a variety of treatment and consultation rooms to help deliver a range of procedures for gynaecological and urology.

The £6 million funding package has also been used to remodel the existing Accident & Emergency Department. Work is ongoing to create an extension to the facility, with additional patient treatment rooms on the ground floor and a separate entrance for paediatric patients. All these works will be completed without effecting the important ongoing services the local A&E provides, although there will be some inconvenience as the work progresses.

Ongoing works to improve the hospitals' current endoscopy and radiology departments, were also highlighted by Mr Murphy which is a further £6m investment that also includes a second MRI scanner. An additional £7 million has been received from the Department for Business, Energy and

Industrial Strategy for decarbonising and increasing energy efficiency at the Hospital. This funding will be used to reduce heating demand and heat loss whilst improving the ward environment for patients and staff and reducing the carbon footprint of the hospital.

Ged Murphy, CEO of East Cheshire NHS Trust said "It's fantastic to see the tremendous amount of hard work which has gone on behind the scenes come to life with support from our regional colleagues".

"Not only will these exciting investment projects help us to deliver truly outstanding, local patient care to the communities of East Cheshire, they will also provide state-of-the-art facilities and development opportunities for our staff"

Speaking after the visit, David said "I was delighted to be able to visit the Maternity Unit and speak to staff for the first time since its successful reopening. I am very grateful to Mr Murphy and the dedicated team at Macclesfield Hospital for all the work they have done and continue to do to safeguard and improve vital local health services. This major funding package is enabling investments in our clinical services at a level we have not seen for many years. It is very positive news for local families and for the sustainable future of our hospital."



MANCHESTER AIRPORT ANNOUNCES JET ZERO SUSTAINABILITY PROGRAMME



Thousands of young people from across the North West will learn about the sustainable future of flying, thanks to a new education programme being delivered at Manchester Airport's AeroZone. Starting in the next academic year, the Northern hub's sustainability experts will deliver 'Jet Zero Education' lessons at the on-site AeroZone educational facility to dozens of schools from their surrounding areas.

Through the use of interactive technology, the curriculum will primarily focus on the role Sustainable Aviation Fuels (SAF) will play in the decarbonisation of aviation. Students will learn how SAF is produced, and the benefits it will bring in reducing aircraft emissions which will help meet the aviation industry's target of net zero by 2050.

The announcement of the Jet Zero curriculum comes as the Government marks one year since the publication of its Jet Zero Strategy, which MAG supported by creating five Jet Zero Pledges, including Jet Zero Education, to support the industry's decarbonisation targets. Neil Robinson, CSR and Airspace Change Director for Manchester Airports Group (MAG), said: "I am pleased to announce today that our Jet Zero Education programme will start in the new academic year.

"Our AeroZone works with young people from an early age to educate and inspire them about the

world of aviation and the opportunities it could present to them. "This initiative is a valuable extension of that, teaching the future generation of aviation professionals about the importance of a transition to net zero air travel, and inspiring them about the role they can play in the delivering that.

"The Jet Zero Strategy continues to play an important part in bringing the sector together and, as today's announcement shows, MAG is wholly committed to delivering on all of the pledges we made 12 months ago.

"As a founding member of the Jet Zero Council, we are proud to be working collaboratively with Government to drive the industry's transition to net zero by 2050."

Manchester Airport's AeroZone was opened in February 2022 by Mayor Andy Burnham, and follows the model of the popular AeroZone facility at its sister airport London Stansted, which has been welcoming pupils since 2010. More than 3,500 school pupils benefitted in its first year. MAG believes that education from an early age plays an integral role in supporting sustainability in the aviation sector, and that by helping the next generation understand the importance of decarbonisation, future industry professionals will continue to drive the agenda.



Alongside its commitment to an education programme, the airport has also made progress on its other pledges across the year. Its Jet Zero Technology competition is offering five years' free landing fees to the first zero-emission aircraft operating transatlantic flights, and it has made significant progress with its Jet Zero Airspace pledge, passing the 'Stage 2' gateway of the Government's airspace modernisation scheme earlier this year.

MAG's other pledges included Jet Zero Research, which will fund three PhD projects focused on aviation decarbonisation, and Jet Zero SAF which will create a financial incentive to encourage airlines to exceed the UK's SAF mandate.

Manchester Airport has established partnerships with Fulcrum BioEnergy UK and Hynet, which could make it the first UK airport with direct supplies of both SAF and Hydrogen respectively. MAG's CSR Strategy 'Working together for a brighter future' is supporting the Group to make its own operations net-zero by 2038, in line with the 2040 target set by the Government in the Jet Zero Strategy last year.

About AeroZone:

AeroZone is an on-site education centre at Manchester Airport. This centre is free to visit and provides a flexible, interactive, and inspirational learning environment for children and young people aged 4-18 (booking is essential).

AeroZone offers a range of tailored interactive experiences and activities, linked to the curriculum, providing a blend of reality, learning and fun.

Students will have the opportunity to immerse themselves in our hands-on, realistic role-play work zones and explore a variety of careers on offer in the dynamic world of aviation and beyond.



SOLAR INSTALLATION PROVIDES SUSTAINABLE ENERGY FOR bennettbrooks



On their journey to becoming a B Corp organisation, bennettbrooks have had solar panels installed at their Macclesfield office at Maple Court.

Utilising solar power is part of their ongoing efforts to reduce the businesses environmental impact and embrace clean energy solutions. In the last twelve months the business has fitted three of its sites with solar panels, with additional installations planned for several of its premises in the future.

Through the installation of solar panels, bennettbrooks are taking a proactive stance in mitigating their carbon footprint and transitioning towards a greener future. Managing Director Yvonne Wood commented "By harnessing the power of the sun, we will generate clean, renewable energy to power our office spaces, reduce our reliance on fossil fuels, and contribute to a more sustainable energy system".

Since their installation in July, the solar panels have generated 2.23MWh saving 431.5 kg CO2 emissions the equivalent of 26 trees. To date 63% of the Macclesfield's office energy consumption is generated by solar power. In addition to bennettbrooks own consumption, they have given 1.25MWh back to the grid.



KINGS STUDENTS UNDERTAKE BORNEO EXPEDITION



An intrepid 31 adventurers from the King's Sixth Form undertook a life-enhancing expedition to Borneo over their summer break.

There they came literally face-to-face with rescued orangutans and sun bears, climbed the 13,454 ft Mount Kinabalu and learned to scuba dive among the multi-coloured marine life. As well as developing their own leadership, teamworking and leadership skills, they undertook work to help local communities, cleaning beaches and renovating village facilities to help create a trekking route to generate a sustainable income for a remote village. The three-week expedition was managed by King's Senior Science Teacher Dr Becky Williams and was designed to reach the parts normal school holidays can't.

Becky said: "Although they had staff leaders and two specialists supporting them, this was very much a student-led trip with the young men and women researching and organising their own schedules. "As well as opening their eyes to a completely different culture with problems and opportunities you simply will never see in the UK, it was about developing team-working and problem solving skills, alongside resilience."

With two leaders from the Outlook team, the 31 students and four staff split into two teams undertaking different activities. Highlights included visiting the Sepilok Orangutan Rehabilitation Centre and the Sunbear Conservation Centre in Sabah. These amazing facilities provide medical care for orphaned and confiscated orangutans and sun bears, the smallest bears in the world, and other species threatened by poaching, illegal pet trade and deforestation.





The trip was a matter of highs and lows. On a low level the teams learned to scuba dive in the warm equatorial waters and on the higher level, they climbed Mount Kinabalu, the third highest island mountain in the world on a grueling but breathtaking trek with overnight camping, part of a survival training experience.

The teams were also assigned to key community projects including cleaning beaches and renovating community buildings and facilities in remote villages. Dr Williams said "I was delighted that the students made this part of their trip an absolute priority, devoting more time in the schedule to community support than had originally been allocated, showing tenacity to finish projects for local communities."

She concluded: "We hope our young people will never forget this experience. I know they enjoyed contributing to the ongoing efforts to clean beaches of large quantities of plastic, renovating spaces for a community project, as well as developing their leadership and independence skills."

Pupil Thomas Krassowski said: "Taking this trip was one of the best decisions I have ever made. It really opened my eyes to other cultures around the world and connect with people I never knew I would be friends with. I have definitely made some memories that will last forever." Pupil Neave Stanway added: "Borneo was without a doubt the best experience in my life. It was full of great laughs, new friendships, and new cultures. I really enjoyed the scuba diving I found the underwater world such a magical place." Fellow pupil Annabel Jordan added: "The trip was absolutely amazing. I really enjoyed experiencing a new culture, testing my limits, and helping a local community."
