

e are over a year into the new government and although the main rates of tax, being income tax, VAT and employees National Insurance have not increased, more and more people are being dragged into higher rates of tax due to tax thresholds being frozen. The effect of this, which is called fiscal drag, can be quite stark and without some planning, you can end up paying far more tax than you need.

So let □s look at this in a bit more detail

You don \Box t start paying tax at the 40% rate until your total taxable income is in excess of £50,270. This allowance has been frozen since 2021 and is set to remain so until at least 2028. This means that if and when you get a salary rise for whatever reason, then there is more chance you will start to pay tax at the 40% rate. Basically, your salary increases but the allowances don \Box t!

It gets worse though!

It gets worse though. Consider the child benefit effect. Child benefit payments are clawed back when one half of a couple earns between £60,000 and £80,000 on a sliding scale. So, you can have 2 people both earning £59,000 and they keep the full allowance but one partner earning above £80,000 (and the other nothing), and they get nothing. Take a couple who have 2 children and the higher earner earns £70,000, even without student loans this equates to a marginal tax rate of 51% on the £10,000 as the child benefit is gradually clawed back. It doesn \Box t sound fair does it, but when has tax ever been fair!

If you thought that was bad...

Consider a person who is in a good job earning say £95,000 per year and they get offered a promotion which would take them to say £110,000 per year. Once your taxable income is over £100,000, you start to lose your personal allowance at the rate of £1 for every £2 you go over. This creates an effective tax rate of 62% on earnings between £100,000 and £125,140. Oh and if you were getting tax free or 30 hours child care, well that disappears completely when one partner earns over £100,000. So that extra £15,000 is suddenly worth a lot

less. If you have pre school age children, you would be better off refusing the promotion or reducing hours \Box with the loss of childcare, the effective tax rate is over 100%

Well do not despair, there are ways that you can mitigate this, but it takes a little bit of planning.

Reduce your exposure

Making personal pension contributions is a great way to reduce your exposure to higher tax rates. Making a contribution has the effect of reducing your income level for tax purposes. This means that one person earning £55,000 pa but making a contribution of £5,000 keeps their income below the higher rate threshold. But remember that you only need to pay £4,000 as the government tops it up by the extra £1,000. The same principle applies at all levels so the savings can be even greater. So making pension contributions are very tax efficient. You can also make charitable donations using gift aid which works in much the same way as pension contributions.

Shifting income

A third possibility is shifting income from one partner to another. Tax thresholds are based on total income so it makes sense for investment assets and income to be in the name of the lower earning spouse to keep total income below certain thresholds. Alternatively, make use of tax free investments such as $ISA \square s$ to keep your income outside the clutches of the taxman.

These are just a few simple ways of beating the tax traps that are waiting out there to catch you but as always when dealing with tax, please make sure you take professional advice. As allways, please do get in touch if you need any further help.



2025 has been packed with fantastic events, bringing members together for meaningful conversations, business development, and plenty of networking along the way. Here's what we've been up to this quarter:




Net-walk at Tatton Park - 3rd April - Tatton Park





Cheshire & Warrington Local Skills Improvement Plan 2025: Progress, Priorities & The Power of Business Voice

As the Cheshire & Warrington Local Skills Improvement Plan (LSIP) completes another year, our 2025 Progress Report showcases a regionwide effort to reshape education and training around the real needs of local business. Approved by the Secretary of State for Education in August 2023, the LSIP is a three-year initiative led by South Cheshire Chamber of Commerce, designed to place businesses at the heart of the skills system.

What Is the Cheshire & Warrington LSIP?

Our LSIP focuses on five key themes: Technical Skills, Accessibility, Employability Competencies, Careers Information, Advice and Guidance (CEIAG). and Educational Professionals, with a focus on transitioning industry professionals into

We aim to bridge the gap between business and post-16 education providers, ensuring that training provision aligns with current and future workforce demands.

Progress Highlights (July 2024 - June

- Technical Skills: Over 4,200 learners have accessed new facilities funded by our Local Skills Improvement Fund (LSIF), including immersive learning environments and green technology hubs. 38 Skills Bootcamps (funded training) are planned for 2025-26.
- Accessibility: More than 55 employers have received support navigating training and funding, including apprenticeship levy transfers. Inclusive initiatives such as SEND-specific careers fairs and youth task forces are helping disadvantaged groups access opportunities.
- **Employability** Competencies Programmes like "Core Skills for 2030" and mock assessment centres have reached over 930 students, embedding essential skills like communication. resilience, and digital literacy into the curriculum.
- CEIAG: Over 6,000 students attended careers fairs, and new work experience models are being trialled in Net Zero, Life Sciences, and Advanced Manufacturing sectors.

Educational Professionals: Initiatives like the Industry Associate Pilot are helping professionals transition into teaching roles while Continued Professional Development and careers awareness training have reached over 60 educators.

What Still Needs to Be Done

Despite strong progress, several challenges

- Increasing capacity within the education system to meet demand for technical course delivery.
- Improving employer understanding of training offers and funding mechanisms.
- Mapping gaps in employability skills provision and ensuring consistent reporting across partners.
- Strengthening engagement disadvantaged groups and promoting inclusive recruitment.

We are actively working with partners to address these issues, with full delivery targeted by August 2026.

Unlike many charities that focus on treatment, Prevent Breast Cancer is the only UK charity dedicated entirely to prevention. Its vision is clear: stop breast cancer before it starts.

ALL SMILES & CELEBRATIONS King's AS BEST EVER RESULTS ARE RECORDED AT KING'S





1) Showcase value - Another way to ensure that you're making money regularly is to show that your product/service is indispensable. To do this, you need to know what their pain points are and then highlight how you can help them

2 Consider retained clients - Having a client on a monthly retainer means they pay you a certain amount every month for a specific amount of work or products. It's a great way to ensure that you're generating a steady amount on a regular basis and can help you to forecast more easily. Why not approach clients who regularly invest in your business with the idea and see where it goes?

3 Ask for advice. Finally, remember that you're never alone in business. The truth is, we've all made the same mistakes and are up against the same challenges. By speaking to other business owners and getting their advice you may even find a solution to a problem you didn't know existed. You can learn from them, bounce ideas around and benefit from a like minded community who know exactly the situation you're in.
