

ASTRAZENECA HOST PUPILS FROM HURDSFIELD PRIMARY SCHOOL



Employees at AstraZeneca's Macclesfield Campus recently played host to a group of 27 Hurdsfield Primary School pupils from years 5 & 6.

The visit began with an introductory talk about what happens behind the doors of the Campus. They were then shown around the Global Packing Centre - where millions of medicines are packed each year - and were also given the opportunity to road-test VR headsets, 3D printing and coding.

We have come across a very sophisticated scam letter which is supposedly from HMRC requesting amounts outstanding for PAYE. Unusually this one comes in the post.

What does the scam look like?

We have reprinted a copy in this article on which we have removed the name and reference. It looks very genuine and authentic, with the right typeset and layout we would expect. In fact, the only thing that makes this stand out is the phone number, which has proven to be fake. In this case, even the collection reference was correct.

What to look for


The phone number shown is 0300 200 3819 and if you see this on any letters from HMRC then please ignore them. If you Google this number, it will show warnings of it being a scam. If you have access to your PAYE account then, please check this first. If you are not sure, then please get in touch with your accountant who will be able to verify if any amounts are due.

Be on your guard!

These types of scams are becoming more and more sophisticated, so please be on your guard against them. Always check the number on any unexpected request for money before you make a payment.

Carl will not admit it since he is too busy fundraising, but he deserves the accolade for amazing service to the community.

Carl is a very dedicated Hospice supporter and was overwhelmed after scooping two awards recognising his dedication. He won Cheshire's Silk 106.9 Pride of Cheshire prize at the Local Hero 2023 Awards, days after receiving a civic award from Macclesfield mayor Cllr Fiona Wilson.

His Team Rainbow has raised more than £70,000 for East Cheshire Hospice where wife Sarah died of breast cancer in 2014, aged 36. He supports many causes, including appeals by the radio station. He also helped a boy with a brain tumour get his wish for an Apple tablet.



Carl said: "It all began when Sarah started holding parties to raise funds and basically, I've continued her legacy. I've not stopped fundraising because that's what she wanted to do.

I know the community are going to give because they're awesome. During lockdown I asked footballers to donate, and they didn't, so I turned to the community and the rest is history. They just nailed it.

It's nice to get recognition, but I don't do it for awards. When Sarah passed away, I got so many messages from people I didn't know and soon realised we're in a good area with good people who care.

I know we've got a good community, so that's why I keep doing what I'm doing, and the Hospice has been at the heart of my fundraising."

MANCHESTER AIRPORT'S COMMUNITY TRUST FUND PASSES £4 MILLION DONATIONS



Manchester Airport's Community Trust Fund has surpassed £4 million of donations to community projects and local charities, with 19 organisations in Greater Manchester and Cheshire benefitting from the latest round of grants.

The Community Trust Fund was set up in 1997 to give the airport a way of giving back to the community. It is managed by a committee of trustees from the area alongside representatives from the airport.

Manchester Airport pays £100,000 per year into the fund, with additional funding provided by other partners. Groups from central Manchester, Tameside, Trafford, Stockport, Cheshire East and Cheshire West are able to bid for up to £3,000 for initiatives with a clear and lasting community benefit. Applications are reviewed by the trustees.

Among those awarded a share of over £24,000 at the latest meeting were Top & Tail Productions, an independent film producer offering free training in filmmaking and acting to Wythenshawe residents. This year it is producing Silver Screen Dreams – a brand new comedy-drama feature film about hope and community – to which the Community Trust Fund will be contributing £1,500. Representatives from the Community Trust Fund, and Mike Kane MP, visited the production team earlier this week.

Rebecca Peacock, a producer on the Silver Screen Dreams project, said: "We are delighted to have been awarded this grant. The funds will help purchase much needed film-making equipment for our participants to use.

"We are hugely excited to make our first feature film together and look forward to engaging the people of Wythenshawe with community filmmaking."

Also set to benefit is 1st Dane Bank Scout Group, in Tameside. They will receive £1,290 towards camping equipment, which will allow them to take their groups on excursions.

Ged Rowles, Group Scout Leader, said: "We appreciate being awarded this grant. It will help us replace some of our old camping equipment and continue to be able to offer camping to our young people.

"These camps are not just a weekend away, they give our young people incredible experiences."

The Time Out Group, in Handforth, has been awarded £1,598 towards furnishing its activity centre. The charity supports adults with autism and learning disabilities.

Time Out Group's Deputy Charity Manager, Anne-Louise Black, said: "We are thrilled to receive this funding, which will pay for improvements to the

facilities on offer in our activity centre. Having extra capacity will allow us to provide more people with opportunities to help them improve their confidence, independence, health and wellbeing and to provide support and respite for their family, parents and carers."

Henshaws, a Manchester-based charity supporting people living with sight loss, will receive more than £800 towards the purchase of two tablet computers.



Shaneka Rianne, Trust & Grants Assistant at Henshaws, said: "The iPads will have a transformative impact on the visually impaired children and young people we support, allowing them to learn, play and be more independent. They will also allow for the children, young people and their families to be able to take part in the evaluation and feedback activities with staff at events."

Chris Woodroofe, Managing Director at Manchester Airport, said: "Manchester Airport isn't just the UK's global gateway in the North - we're a part of the community here in South Manchester and Cheshire and it's really important that we're able to give something back.

"The Community Trust Fund means our neighbours are able to benefit from the airport and share in its successes. Its longevity symbolises the strength of our commitment to the area and we are thrilled to have now passed £4 million of donations."

Mike Kane, Wythenshawe and Sale East MP, added: "Congratulations to all the successful applicants in this round of Manchester Airport's Community Trust Fund.

"It was great to meet with Top & Tail Productions and see how the funds they have received will support free training in filmmaking and acting to Wythenshawe residents. KING'S PRETTY IN PINK TO PREVENT BREAST CANCER



The King's School looked pretty pink as it spent a week in April raising money for Prevent Breast Cancer, a charity based at the Nightingale Breast Cancer Unit at Wythenshawe Hospital.

The King's campus on Prestbury Road, Macclesfield, was bathed in pink lighting every night, the swimming school turned pink for the week and glowing pink bows adorned the trees that line the school's central boulevard.

Even King's all-conquering rugby team got in on the act, swapping their shorts and gum shields for pink tutus, while staff and pupils were encouraged to exchange their royal blue for something with the rose-tinted hue.

Breast cancer is the UK's largest cause of death in middle-aged women with 153 women receiving what can be a chilling and life changing diagnosis every day.

The Nightingale Breast Cancer Unit at Wythenshawe Hospital is Europe's first ever purpose-built combined breast cancer prevention and treatment centre, both diagnosing the disease and conducting research into prediction and prevention for tomorrow's women and, in one per cent of cases, for men too.

Patron of the Charity and a King's School former parent, Margo Cornish, said: "I am proud to support

this charity because I believe that through their research, they will gradually diminish the number of women affected by breast cancer. The statistics speak for themselves; if Cancer Research UK are right and rates keep rising, around 1 in 6 women will be affected in the future."

Margo added: "Going into schools and speaking to young people is very valuable. It's not just the fundraising that is important, getting young people into the habit of checking themselves from their late teens will definitely have an impact on detection and survival rates going forward."

She continued: "Not many people can say that they don't know someone affected by breast cancer, so our target audience is widespread. All genders, anyone with breast tissue, can be at risk. We asked the students to take the checking guide home with them to remind other family members."

Last year, the Prevent Breast Cancer charity raised over a stunning £1.5 million, which was used to fund research, awareness and operational costs.

Helen Broadley, Principal of King's Senior Division, said: "Our pupils, parents and staff – many of whom have been affected by this disease – pulled together to raise over £1,320 in one week which will help Prevent Breast Cancer in their aim of predicting, preventing and treating the UK's most common cancer."




